THIS IS THE MOMENT WE ASK FOR THE BLESSING THAT LIVES WITHIN THE ANCIENT ASHES, THAT MAKES ITS HOME INSIDE THE SOIL OF THIS SACRED EARTH. SO LET US BE MARKED NOT FOR SORROW. AND LET US BE MARKED NOT FOR SHAME. LET US BE MARKED NOT FOR FALSE HUMILITY OR FOR THINKING WE ARE LESS THAN WE ARE BUT FOR CLAIMING WHAT GOD CAN DO WITHIN THE DUST. WITHIN THE DIRT, WITHIN THE STUFF OF WHICH THE WORLD IS MADE AND THE STARS THAT BLAZE IN OUR BONES AND THE GALAXIES THAT SPIRAL INSIDE THE SMUDGE WE BEAR.

ORIGINALLY CALLED DIES CINERUM (DAY OF ASHES), ASH WEDNESDAY DATES BACK FROM AT LEAST THE 8TH CENTURY. ASHES HISTORICALLY SYMBOLIZE AN OUTER MANIFESTATION OF INNER REPENTANCE AND HUMILITY. THIS PRACTICE IS NOT PRESCRIBED BIBLICALLY BUT IS DEEPLY ROOTED IN CHRISTIAN ANTIQUITY, BRINGING FOLLOWERS OF CHRIST TOGETHER EACH YEAR TO BEGIN THE SEASON OF LENT. JUST AS DANIEL COMES "PLEADING IN EARNEST PRAYER, WITH FASTING, SACKCLOTH AND ASHES" (DN 9:3) AS A SIGN OF ISRAEL'S REPENTANCE. WE TOO COME TOGETHER AS AN ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF OUR OWN FRAILTY AND NEED FOR RENEWAL. IN THE SERVICE, REMINDED THAT WE ARE DUST AND THAT IT IS TO DUST THAT WE SHALL RETURN (GN 3:19), ASHES ARE PLACED ON THE PENITENT'S FOREHEAD (IF SO DESIRED) IN THE SHAPE OF A CROSS TO SIGNIFY THE SACRIFICE OF CHRIST, WHICH HAS BROUGHT RECONCILIATION WITH GOD. THESE ASHES ARE IDEALLY MADE FROM BURNING PALM BRANCHES FROM THE PREVIOUS PALM SUNDAY, REMEMBERING JESUS APPROACHING JERUSALEM AND HIS IMMINENT DEATH. ALTHOUGH THE EMPHASIS UPON FRAILTY AND REPENTANCE IS CENTRAL ON ASH WEDNESDAY. THE ANTICIPATION AND HOPE OF EASTER SUNDAY REMAINS PRESENT AND CENTRAL.

A MEMENTO MORI (LATIN FOR 'REMEMBER THAT YOU MUST DIE') IS AN ARTISTIC AND SYMBOLIC REMINDER OF THE INEVITABILITY OF DEATH. THE EXPRESSION 'MEMENTO MORI' SERVES AS A REMINDER THAT OUR TIME IS LIMITED, THAT WE, LIKE JESUS, MUST PASS THROUGH DEATH IN ORDER TO EXPERIENCE RESURRECTION.
